

<b>Offense</b>	<b>Description or Definition</b>
ABHAN- <i>Assault and Battery of a High and Aggravated Nature</i>	Unlawful act of violence to another person with the intent to inflict serious bodily injury to include a deadly weapon.
ABWITK- <i>Assault and Battery With Intent to Kill</i>	Unlawful act of a violent nature with malicious intent to commit serious bodily injury/death where the victim suffers serious injury.
AGGRAVATED ASSAULT	Victim Suffers Serious Injury
ARMED ROBBERY	Subject is armed with some sort of weapon (gun, knife, etc.) to steal money/items.
ARSON	Intentionally sets a fire.
ASSAULT	Fighting with another person, injuries not always evident.
ASSAULT ON POLICE OFFICER	Self explanatory
ASSAULT ON PUBLIC OFFICIAL	Self explanatory
ASSAULT W/DEADLY WEAPON	Assault using a gun, knife, etc.
ARSON	Illegally sets a fire.
ATTEMPTED ARSON	Attempted to illegally set a fire.
ATTEMPTED AUTO THEFT	Evidence that vehicle was tampered with in an effort to steal it.
ATTEMPTED AUTOBREAKING	Evidence that vehicle was tampered with in an effort to gain entry to it.
ATTEMPTED BURGLARY	Evidence that home was damaged in an effort to gain entry.
ATTEMPTED CARJACKING	Attempting to take someone's vehicle by using threat/force.
ATTEMPTED KIDNAPPING	Attempting to detain someone against their will.
ATTEMPTED ROBBERY	Attempting to rob someone – does not involve use of weapon.
AUTO THEFT	Theft of a motor vehicle – does not matter if vehicle was locked or unlocked.
BANK ROBBERY	Taking money by threat/demand from a financial institution.
BEGGING	Self explanatory
BOMB THREAT	Self explanatory
BREACH OF TRUST	Person deprives owner of property entrusted to him/her. (to include individuals or businesses)
B&E MOTOR VEHICLE- <i>(Breaking &amp; Entering)</i>	Illegal entry into a motor vehicle with the intent to steal items from the vehicle– does not matter if vehicle was locked or unlocked.
BURGLARY 1 <sup>st</sup> = (First Degree)	When a person enters a <b>Dwelling</b> without consent with the intent to commit a crime in the dwelling: person can be: 1) armed with a deadly weapon; 2) causes physical injury to a victim; 3) threatens to use a dangerous instrument; 4) has had prior burglary convictions; 4) occurs at night. (does not matter if residence/garage was locked or unlocked)
BURGLARY 2 <sup>nd</sup> = (Second Degree)	When a person enters a <b>Dwelling/Building</b> without consent with the intent to commit a crime in the dwelling: person can be: 1) armed with a deadly weapon; 2) causes physical injury to a victim; 3) threatens to use a dangerous instrument; 4) has had prior burglary convictions; 4) occurs at night.
BURGLARY 3 <sup>rd</sup> = (Third Degree)	When a person enters a <b>Building</b> without consent with the intent to commit a crime.
CARJACKING	Taking someone's vehicle by force – may or may not involve use of weapon.
COUNTERFEITING	Obtains property by presenting fake/false currency/check.
DEATH INVESTIGATION	This means the death has not been ruled accidental or intentional yet.
DISCHARGING FIREARM/CITY (DNR) Do Not Report	Discharging a firearm within City Limits. Not reportable as a State Statute
DUS – Driving Under Suspension	Self-explanatory
FELON IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM	Self explanatory – (Felon – person convicted of a crime and sentenced)
FORGERY	Presenting Counterfeit/Forged Check or Document.
GRAFFITI	Self explanatory – police see this a lot with Gang activity.
GRAND LARCENY	Taking property valued over \$1000.00.
GUN LAW VIOLATION	Violating the South Carolina Gun Law.
HINDERING AN OFFICER	Preventing a law enforcement officer from performing his duties.
KIDNAPPING	Detaining a person for a period of time against their will.
LYNCHING	Act of violence committed by 2 or more persons upon an individual with the intent to inflict bodily injury.
LYNCHING I = (First Degree)	Act of violence committed by 2 or more persons upon an individual with the intent to inflict bodily injury, which results in the death of a person.

LYNCHING II = (Second Degree)	Act of violence committed by 2 or more persons upon an individual with the intent to inflict bodily injury, but does not result in the death of a person.
MAL DEST PERS PROP- <i>Malicious Destruction of Personal Property</i>	Damaging vehicle or other personal property (less than \$1000).
MAL DEST REAL PROP- <i>Malicious Destruction of Real Estate Property</i>	Damaging Home, Bldg. or Fixed object (less than \$1000).
MANSLAUGHTER	Self explanatory
MURDER	Self explanatory
OBTAINING GOODS UNDER FALSE PRETENSES	Obtaining property with intent to defraud. (ex: NSF ck. Etc)
PDOC- <i>Public Disorderly Conduct</i>	Self explanatory
PILFERING MOTOR VEHICLE	Illegally entering a motor vehicle with the intent to steal items.
POINTING/PRESENTING A FIREARM	Examples: guns pulled during gang fights, guns pointed in Road Rage incidents, etc.
PETIT LARCENY	Taking property valued below \$1000.00.
POSSESSION OF BURGLARY TOOLS	Used when suspicious individuals are found with items such as gloves, screwdrivers, etc.
POSSESSION OF A FIREARM UNDER 21	Self explanatory
PURSE SNATCHING	Form of Robbery where intent is to take the purse.
ROBBERY	Taking money/items by threat/demand (no weapon involved).
SHOOTING INTO A DWELLING	Self explanatory
SIMPLE ASSAULT	Definition has to do with the nature of injuries caused.
STRONG ARMED ROBBERY	Robbery using force or threats.
UNLAWFUL CARRYING OF A WEAPON	Carrying a weapon without being licensed.
VANDALISM	Self explanatory - mostly used in damages that occur at schools/businesses/vehicles.
VOYEURISM	Unlike Peeping Tom - this offender usual disrobes (all or partially).
