

A. Policy

1. General order 1914 does not preclude the transport of prisoners in vehicles that do not have cages or other vehicles that are not normally or primarily utilized for prisoner transportation if the transportation of prisoners can be conducted safely.
2. At the officer's discretion, if the prisoner can be transported safely in a vehicle which is not generally utilized for prisoner transport (i.e. a "non-cage-equipped" car, etc) the officer may elect to transport the prisoner in the front passenger seat if the officer is alone or if there are two officers in the vehicle, the front passenger seat or a rear seat may be used. The prisoner must be restrained.
3. A supervisor may grant permission or request that an officer transport a prisoner in a vehicle that is not primarily utilized for transport of prisoners but the transporting officer will be allowed to make the final decision and the transporting officer is authorized to refuse to transport a prisoner in such circumstances. Refusal to transport a prisoner in a vehicle not primarily utilized for such purposes will have no negative consequences for the transporting officer.
