

The City of Anderson Detention Center

Mission Statement

The mission of the City of Anderson Detention Center is to provide the highest level of public service regarding the custody and care of inmates. The mission includes but is not limited to (1) maintaining high standards of ethical conduct, (2) meeting or exceeding South Carolina state standards which regulate the operation of the detention center, (3) providing safe, secure and sanitary conditions for inmates and (4) maintaining a well trained and professional staff.

The three primary functions of the City of Anderson Detention Center are: (1) the care and custody of Anderson City inmates, (2) the care and custody of inmates for the United States Marshal's Service and (3) the safe and secure escort of city and federal inmates to outside locations.



Fiscal Year 2010 Detention Center Summary

1. During Fiscal Year 2010¹ (July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010) the City of Anderson Detention Center booked in a total of 3,197 people, down 304 from 3,501 in FY09.
 - a. A total of 2,936 city arrestees were booked in, down 317 from 3,253 in FY09.
 - b. A total of 261 federal detainees were booked in, up 13 from 248 in FY09.
2. The average daily population of inmates was 110.61, up 3.86 (+3.6%) from 106.75 in FY09.²
 - a. The daily average population of federal inmates was 62.81, up 2.14 (+3.5%) from 60.67 in FY09.
 - b. The daily average population of city inmates was 47.80, up 1.72 (+3.7%) from 46.08 in FY09.
3. The demographic breakdown of the (approximate) 3,197 persons booked into the City of Anderson Detention Center during FY10 is as follows:

4. In FY10, 121,083 meals were served by the jail, up 4,155 (+3.55%) from 116,928 in FY09. This was a per-day average of 331.73, up 11.38 (+3.55%) from 320.35 per day in FY09.
5. In FY10, the total meal cost was \$207,649.02, up \$10,309.77 (+5.2%) from \$197,339.25 in FY09. The average meal cost was \$1.71, up \$0.02 (+1.2%) from \$1.69 in FY09.
6. The total revenue generated by the Detention Center was \$1,199,489.43, up \$116,550.44 (+10.8%) from \$1,082,938.99 in FY09.³
 - a. Federal Inmate Per Diem (housing) Billing was \$1,164,924.55, up \$120,836.53 (+11.6%) from \$1,044,088.02 in FY09.
 - b. Detention telephone revenue was \$34,564.88, down \$4,286.09 (-11%) from \$38,850.97 in FY09.
7. The total expense for operating the Detention Center was \$1,669,286.96, down \$66,918.83 (-3.8%) from \$1,736,205.79 in FY09.
8. The Detention Center contributed approximately \$302,857 of In-kind work to the city, the same as FY09.

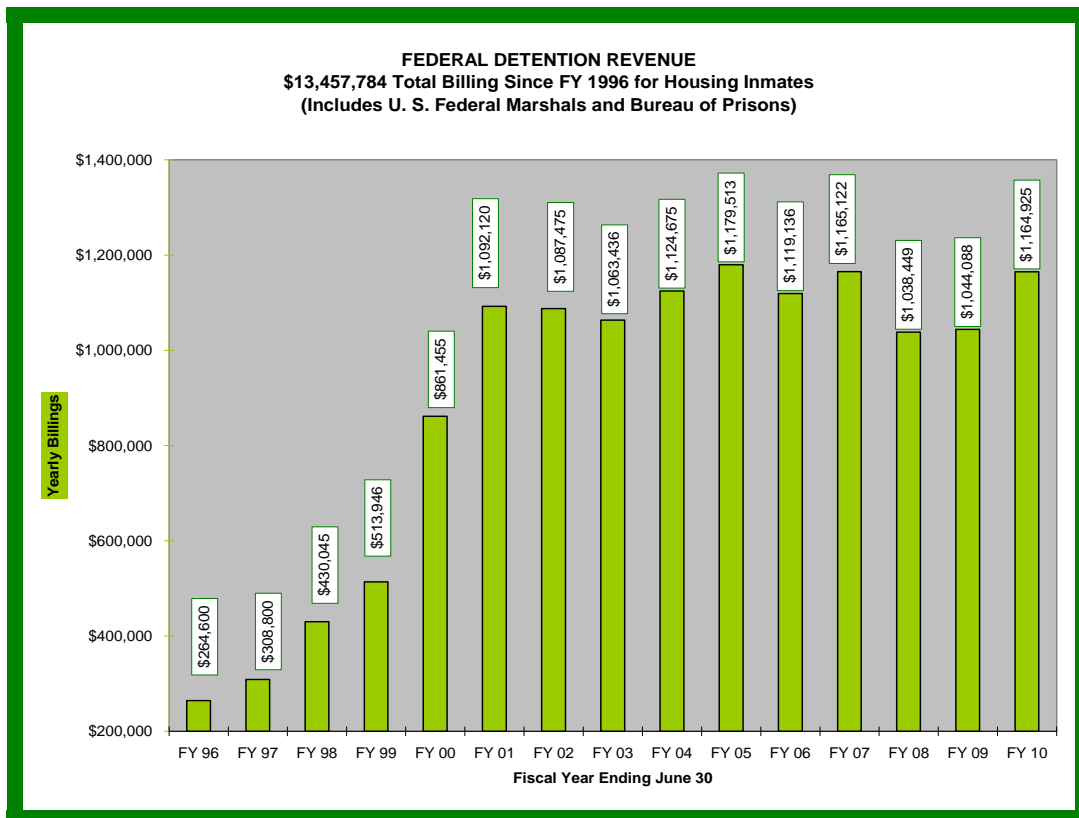
I. City of Anderson Detention Center Overview

As of the end of FY10, the City of Anderson Detention Center employed 32 personnel, two of whom were sworn police officers. The Detention Center served an average of 331.73 meals per day to an average of 110.61 inmates per day.

During FY10⁴ (July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010) the Detention Center generated cash revenue (billings) of \$1,199,489.43 and had a total expense of \$1,669,286.96.⁵

The Detention Center is especially proud of its United States Marshal’s assistance program. For approximately seventeen years the Detention Center has provided housing for federal inmates who are awaiting final disposition of their case(s). The United States Marshal’s Service compensates the Detention Center for housing persons whose cases are pending in Federal Court. The Bureau of Prisons compensates the Detention Center for housing persons who have received a final disposition and are awaiting a transfer to their designated facility. During FY09, the Detention Center renegotiated its per diem charge with the federal prison system to \$50 per day per inmate, up \$5 (+11.1%) per day from \$45. The new rate took effect on March 31, 2009 for the United States Marshall’s Service and on April 1, 2009 for the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

The following chart illustrates the amount of yearly federal funding generated by the City of Anderson by the Detention Center’s Federal Inmate Housing Program since FY96.⁶

In-Kind Contribution

In addition to the direct revenue contribution to the city, additional contributions of an “in-kind” nature totaling \$302,857 were realized in FY10. In-kind contributions provided by the Detention Center to the community are in the form of maintenance services (a.k.a. the *Jail Work Program*). These services are provided by inmates who are working off their charges in the city jail and by state prisoners who are assigned to the Detention Center to assist with the day-to-day operation of the Detention Center. They may also provide general maintenance services to the Police Department as well as some services to City Hall and the Municipal Business Center.⁷

Jail Work Program. The City of Anderson Detention Center provides necessary general labor services to the city at no charge. Services are performed by inmates who are sentenced for a variety of misdemeanor convictions in City Court. In FY10, approximately twelve inmates worked eight hours per day for approximately 200 days providing services that were conservatively valued at \$7.50 per hour. Typical services provided by the work group included general cleaning of city buildings, washing city vehicles, kitchen work, and light landscaping duties on city-owned properties and right-of-ways around town. The value of these services (base pay + benefits) in FYs 2009 and 2010 was valued at \$206,899. This was an increase of \$34,303 (+19.9%) from \$172,596 in FY08. The increase was due to an additional two inmates (12) being used on average compared to 10 in FY08.

State Prisoners Assigned to City. In addition to the city’s jail work program, three inmates from the South Carolina Department of Corrections are assigned to the City of Anderson Detention Center for the purpose of providing general labor services to the Detention Center, the Police Department and City Hall. The inmates assigned to the APD worked an average of 56 hours per week during FY10. The value of their services to the city in FY10 was \$95,958, remaining constant for the third consecutive fiscal year.

Detention Center Personnel

The City of Anderson Detention Center provides three primary functions:

- Housing of City Inmates
- Housing of Federal Inmates
- Transportation of Inmates to Other Locations

Personnel. At the end of FY10, the City of Anderson Detention Center employed 32 budgeted personnel. The positions included booking officers, jailers, part-time nurses, transport officers and supervisors. Other than the medical staff, no part-time personnel were utilized in the Detention Center in FY10. The 32 budgeted positions included two sworn police positions: a Captain and a Lieutenant. In addition, the other 30 budgeted positions consisted of a Detention Lieutenant, 4 Detention Sergeants, 23 Detention Officers and 2 part-time nurse slots. As of June 30, 2010, all 32 slots were filled.

Booking officers receive arrestees into the city’s Detention Center and are the arrestees’ first contact with detention personnel. In addition to introducing new inmates to the center, they also prepare the initial folder used for prosecution in City Court and General Sessions Court by insuring that all necessary paperwork, warrants, and charges are filled out. Moreover, they photograph and fingerprint the inductees for identification.

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Jailers maintain day-to-day custody of inmates in the Detention Center. They insure that food is prepared and served on time, medication(s) are dispensed in the proper quantities and at the appropriate times, and that inmates have the benefit of clean clothing and bedding. They also perform routine counts to verify that everyone is present.

Transport officers are primarily responsible for moving inmates from one place to another. As a general rule, these personnel are utilized to take federal inmates to and from court and other locations deemed necessary by the U.S. Marshal's Service.

Fiscal Year 2010 was the third full year in which the Detention Center was a "stand alone" unit. The approved positions for the Detention Center as of the end of Fiscal Year 2010 were as follows:

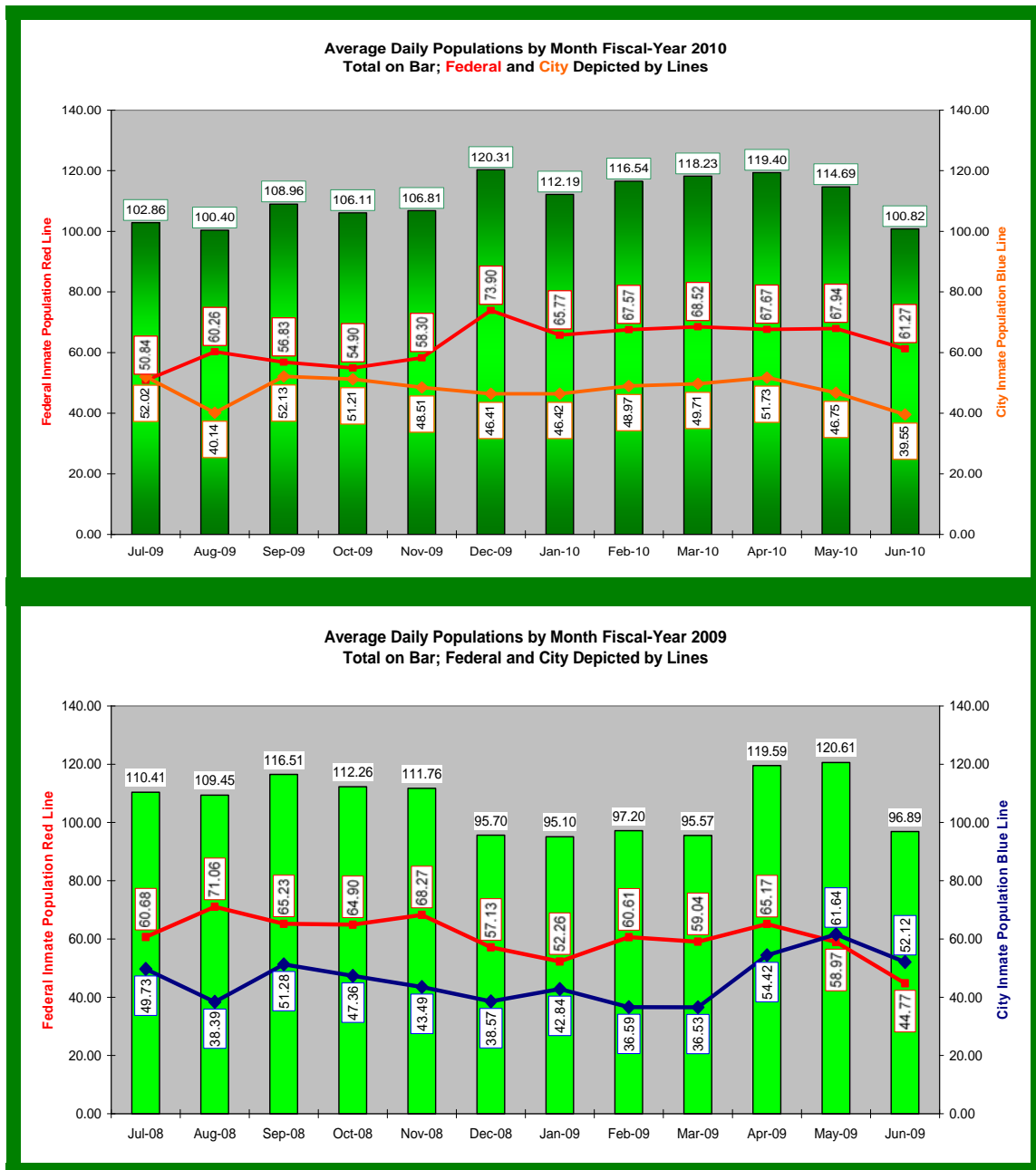

II. Major Accomplishments

Daily Operations

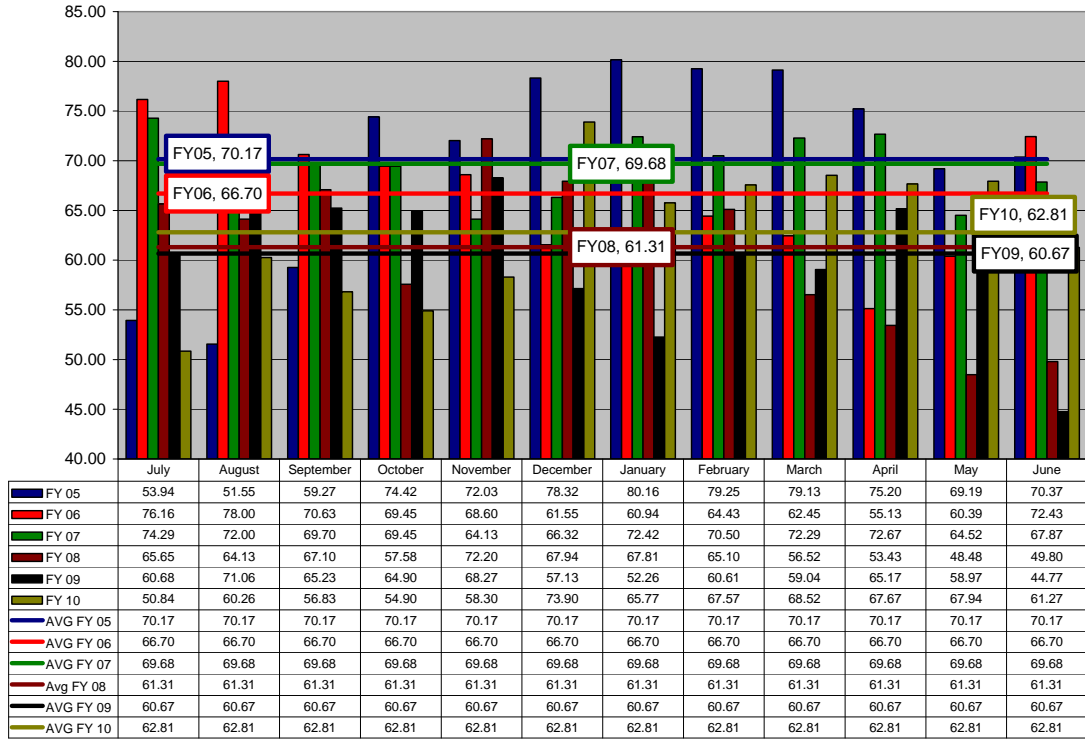
The daily population. During FY10, The average daily inmate population was 110.61, up 3.86 (+3.6%) from 106.75 in FY09.⁸ Federal Inmates accounted for 62.81, up 2.14 (+3.5%) from 60.67 in FY09. City inmates averaged 47.8, up 1.72 (+3.7%) from 46.08 in FY09.

The range of figures for city inmates' average monthly population fluctuated from a low of 39.55 in June 2010 to a high of 52.02 in July 2009. In FY09 the range for city inmates was 36.53 to 61.64. The FY10 range for average monthly populations of federal inmates was from 50.84 in July 2009 to 73.90 in December 2009. In FY09 the range for federal inmates was from 44.77 to 71.06. The below chart illustrates the average daily populations per month along with the figure for each category in Fiscal Year 2010.

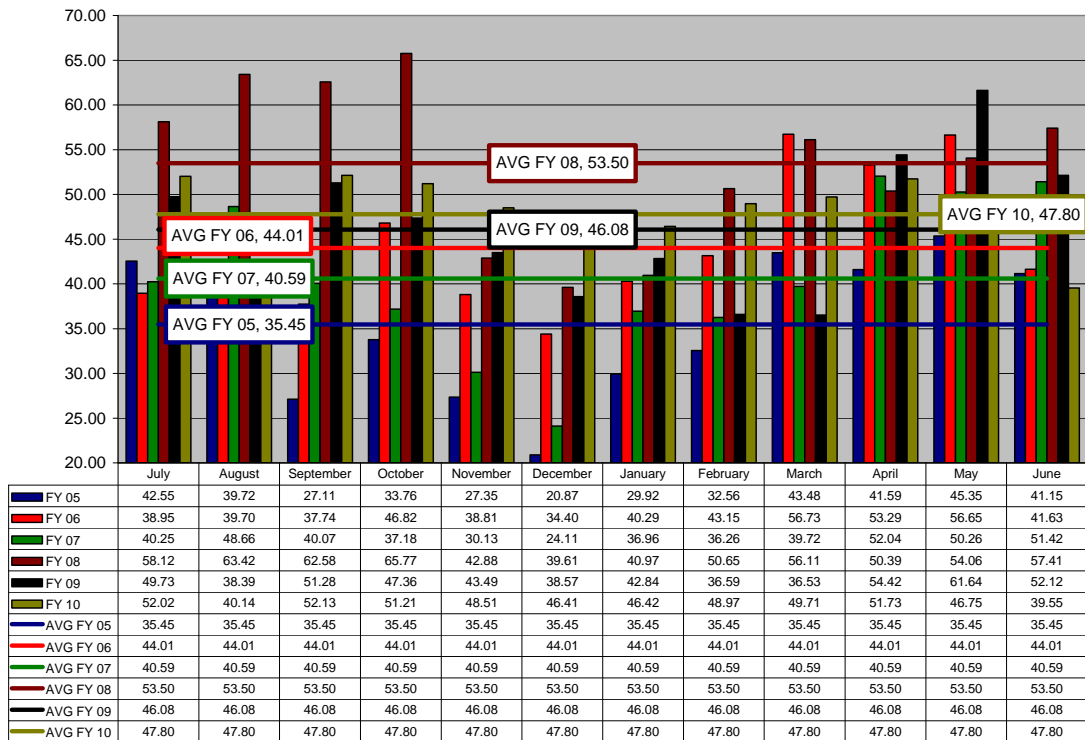

III. FY10 Goals & Evaluation of Goals

FY10 Goals & Evaluation of Goals

1. **Design and implement a professional career developmental plan for detention officers to move into supervision within the Detention Center.**

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal has been achieved.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

The City of Anderson Detention Center has achieved the goal of moving detention officers into positions of management. Each of the four shifts is supervised by a detention supervisor. Each of these supervisors is responsible to the Detention Operations Lieutenant. All five of these supervisors are slated for management training in the near future.

2. **Enhance the security of the Detention Center by installing a state of the art digital video recording system throughout the facility.**

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal awaits completion.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

The “federal jail” has yet to have the necessary security upgrades due to a lack of funding.

3. **Pursue accreditation for the Detention Center through the South Carolina Jail Administrators Association. (Note: This is separate and in addition to state accreditation for the Police Department.)**

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal awaits completion.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

The SCCJA has yet to finalize the criterion for accreditation.

4. **Increase the federal per-diem rate.**

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal was achieved in FY09.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

In FY09, the Detention Center negotiated a per diem rate increase from \$45 per day to \$50 per day. These increases became effective on March 31, 2009 for the United States Marshall’s Service and April 1, 2009 for the Bureau of Prisons. The contract remained in effect throughout FY10 without additional opportunities for an increase.

5. Increase the Federal Inmate Population to an average of 76 per day.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal awaits completion.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

Seventy-six is the approximate max for federal inmates and is therefore a very aggressive goal. The inmate population continues to fluctuate from month to month and results primarily from the number of inmates that the federal law enforcement agencies - including the United States Marshal's Service - decide to place in the city of Anderson. The average daily population of federal inmates in FY10 was 62.81, an increase from FY09's average daily population of 60.67. Additionally, the range of average daily populations by month for FY10 was 50.84 to 73.9, a range with both lows and highs exceeding fiscal year 2009's lows and highs of 44.77 and 71.06. This upward shift in the range is seen as a positive move for the data set.

6. Increase the amount of in-kind work services provided to the City of Anderson.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal was partially achieved in that the In-kind contribution remained constant with FY09 at \$302,857. FY09's figure was an increase of 12.7% over FY08.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

In FY09, the inmate work crew was increased from an average of 10 per day to 12 per day.

7. Continue to recruit and hire qualified women and minorities.

Extent to which goal was achieved: The goal was moderately achieved.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

Minority and women recruitment continues to be a priority for the APD Detention Center. At present, there are 12 women and two minorities employed in the Detention Center. There were more minorities but two were placed in preferred slots in the P.D. and one separated from employment.

8. Pursue and complete the state accreditation process.

Extent to which goal was achieved: The Detention Center's portion of the City of Anderson Police Department's state accreditation has been completed.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

According to the Detention Center's managers, all required general orders for the management of the Detention Center have been developed and are complete.

IV. Conclusion

The City of Anderson Detention Center had a good year in FY10. As in previous years and consistent with department policy, the public safety was effectively maintained, service was provided in a professional manner, and the Detention Center contributed a substantial amount of funds to the City of Anderson's tax base. The revenue generated by the Detention Center in Fiscal Year 2010 was substantially above the yearly average for the 15-year period ending FY10.

Detention Center management has developed a plan for increasing the federal inmate count and is preparing to meet the challenges of housing the next generation of criminals. The proactive programs which have been enacted in the last few years are beginning to show their anticipated long-range payoffs. The Detention Center plans to continue improving upon current programs and will continue to seek new and innovative approaches to housing inmates.

V. Goals for Fiscal Year 2011

1. Continue to refine and implement a professional career developmental plan for detention officers to move into supervision within the Detention Center.
2. Enhance the security of the Detention Center by installing a state of the art digital video recording system throughout the facility.
3. Pursue accreditation for the Detention Center through the South Carolina Jail Administrators Association. (Note: This is separate and in addition to state accreditation for the Police Department.)
4. Evaluate grant-funding possibilities for upgrades.
5. Increase the Federal Inmate Population to an average of 76 per day.
6. Increase the amount of in-kind work services provided to the city of Anderson.
7. Continue to recruit and hire qualified women and minorities.
8. Pursue and complete the state accreditation process.
9. Remove visitation from within the jail via the implementation of a video/audio system.
