The City of Anderson Detention Center

Mission Statement

The mission of the City of Anderson Detention Center is to provide the highest level of public service regarding the custody and care of inmates. The mission includes but is not limited to (1) maintaining high standards of ethical conduct, (2) meeting or exceeding South Carolina state standards which regulate the operation of the detention center, (3) providing safe, secure and sanitary conditions for inmates and (4) maintaining a well trained and professional staff.

The three primary functions of the City of Anderson Detention Center are: (1) the care and custody of Anderson City inmates, (2) the care and custody of inmates for the United States Marshal's Service and (3) the safe and secure escort of city and federal inmates to outside locations.



Fiscal Year 2011 Detention Center Summary

- 1. During Fiscal Year 2011¹ (July 1, 2010 June 30, 2011) the City of Anderson Detention Center booked in a total of 2,689 people, down 508 from 3,197 in FY10.
 - a. A total of 2,448 city arrestees were booked in, down 488 from 2,936 in FY10.
 - b. A total of 241 federal detainees were booked in, down 20 from 261 in FY10.
- 2. The average daily population of inmates was 101.31, down 9.3 (-8.4%) from 110.61 in FY10.²
 - a. The daily average population of federal inmates was 53.78, down 9.03 (-14.4%) from 62.81 in FY10.
 - b. The daily average population of city inmates was 47.53, down 0.27 (-0.5%) from 47.80 in FY10.
 - 3. The demographic breakdown of the (approximate) 2,689 persons booked into the City of Anderson Detention Center during FY11 is as follows:

- 4. In FY11, 110,895 meals were served by the jail, down 10,188 (-8.4%) from 121,083 in FY10. This was a per-day average of 303.82, down 27.91 (-8.4%) from 331.73 per day in FY10.
- 5. In FY11, the total meal cost was \$210,877.57, up \$3,288.55 (+1.55%) from \$207,649.02 in FY10. The average meal cost was \$1.90, up \$0.19 (+11.1%) from \$1.71 in FY10.
- 6. The total revenue generated by the Detention Center was \$1,032,183.85, down \$167,305.58 (-13.9%) from \$1,199,489.43 in FY10.³
 - a. Federal Inmate Per Diem (housing) Billing was \$1,003,576.81, down \$161,347.74 (-13.9%) from \$1,164,924.55 in FY10.
 - b. Detention telephone revenue was \$28,607.04, down \$5,957.84 (-17.2%) from \$34,564.88 in FY10.
- 7. The total expense for operating the Detention Center was \$1,792,346.67, up \$123,059.71 (+7.4%) from \$1,669,286.96, in FY10.
- 8. The Detention Center contributed approximately \$302,857 of In-kind work to the city, the same as FY10.

I. <u>City of Anderson Detention Center Overview</u>


As of the end of FY11, the City of Anderson Detention Center employed 32 personnel, two of whom were sworn police officers. The Detention Center served an average of 303.82 meals per day to an average of 101.31 inmates per day.

During FY11⁴ (July1, 2010 – June 30, 2011) the Detention Center generated cash revenue (billings) of \$1,032,183.85 and had a total expense of \$1,792,346.67.⁵

In FY11, the average daily cost of housing an inmate was \$48.47.

The Detention Center is especially proud of its United States Marshal's assistance program. For approximately eighteen years the Detention Center has provided housing for federal inmates who are awaiting final disposition of their case(s). The United States Marshal's Service compensates the Detention Center for housing persons whose cases are pending in Federal Court. The Bureau of Prisons compensates the Detention Center for housing persons who have received a final disposition and are awaiting a transfer to their designated facility. During FY09, the Detention Center renegotiated its per diem charge with the federal prison system to \$50 per day per inmate, up \$5 (+11.1%) per day from \$45. The new rate took effect on March 31, 2009 for the United States Marshall's Service and on April 1, 2009 for the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

The following chart illustrates the amount of yearly federal funding generated by the City of Anderson by the Detention Center's Federal Inmate Housing Program since FY96.⁶

In-Kind Contribution

In addition to the direct revenue contribution to the city, additional contributions of an "in-kind" nature totaling \$302,857 were realized in FY11. In-kind contributions provided by the Detention Center to the community are in the form of maintenance services (a.k.a. the *Jail Work Program*). These services are provided by inmates who are working off their charges in the city jail and by state prisoners who are assigned to the Detention Center to assist with the day-to-day operation of the Detention Center. They may also provide general maintenance services to the Police Department as well as some services to City Hall and the Municipal Business Center.⁷

Jail Work Program. The City of Anderson Detention Center provides necessary general labor services to the city at no charge. Services are performed by inmates who are sentenced for a variety of misdemeanor convictions in City Court. In FY11, approximately twelve inmates worked eight hours per day for approximately 200 days providing services that were conservatively valued at \$7.50 per hour. Typical services provided by the work group included general cleaning of city buildings, washing city vehicles, kitchen work, and light landscaping duties on city-owned properties and right-of-ways around town. The value of these services (base pay + benefits) in FYs 2009, 2010 and 2011 was valued at \$206,899. This was an increase of \$34,303 (+19.9%) from \$172,596 in FY08. The increase was due to an additional two inmates (12) being used on average compared to 10 in FY08.

State Prisoners Assigned to City. In addition to the city's jail work program, three inmates from the South Carolina Department of Corrections are assigned to the City of Anderson Detention Center for the purpose of providing general labor services to the Detention Center, the Police Department and City Hall. The inmates assigned to the APD worked an average of 56 hours per week during FY11. The value of their services to the city in FY11 was \$95,958, remaining constant for the fourth consecutive fiscal year.

Detention Center Personnel

The City of Anderson Detention Center provides three primary functions:

- Housing of City Inmates
- Housing of Federal Inmates
- Transportation of Inmates to Other Locations

Personnel. At the end of FY11, the City of Anderson Detention Center employed 33 budgeted personnel. The positions included booking officers, jailers, part-time nurses, transport officers and supervisors. Other than the medical staff, no part-time personnel were utilized in the Detention Center in FY11. The 33 budgeted positions included three sworn police positions: a Captain and two Lieutenants. In addition, the other 30 budgeted positions consisted of a Detention Lieutenant, 4 Detention Sergeants, 23 Detention Officers and 2 part-time nurse slots. As of June 30, 2011, 31 slots were filled and there were 2 vacancies. An additional two personnel were in the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy or awaiting certification.

Booking officers receive arrestees into the city's Detention Center and are the arrestees' first contact with detention personnel. In addition to introducing new inmates to the center, they also prepare the initial folder used for prosecution in City Court and General Sessions Court by insuring that all necessary paperwork, warrants, and charges are filled out. Moreover, they photograph and fingerprint the inductees for identification.

Jailers maintain day-to-day custody of inmates in the Detention Center. They insure that food is prepared and served on time, medication(s) are dispensed in the proper quantities and at the appropriate times, and that inmates have the benefit of clean clothing and bedding. They also perform routine counts to verify that everyone is present.

Transport officers are primarily responsible for moving inmates from one place to another. As a general rule, these personnel are utilized to take federal inmates to and from court and other locations deemed necessary by the U.S. Marshal's Service.

Fiscal Year 2011 was the fourth full year in which the Detention Center was a "stand alone" unit. The approved positions for the Detention Center as of the end of Fiscal Year 2011 were as follows:


Daily Operations


The daily population. During FY11, The overall average daily inmate population was 101.31, down 9.3 (-8.4%) from 110.61 in FY10.8 The average Federal Inmate population was 53.78, down 9.03 (-14.4%) from 62.81 in FY10. City inmates averaged 47.53, down 0.27 (-0.5%) from 47.80 in FY10.

The city inmates' average monthly population fluctuated from a low of 38.81 in December 2010 to a high of 63.44 in March 2011. In FY10 the range for city inmates was 39.55 to 52.02. The FY11 range for average monthly populations of federal inmates was from 37.93 in June 2011 to 63.65 in July 2010. In FY10 the range for federal inmates was from 50.84 to 73.90. The below chart illustrates the average daily populations per month along with the figure for each category in Fiscal Year 2010.

III. FY11 Goals & Evaluation of Goals

FY11 Goals & Evaluation of Goals

1. Continue to refine and implement a professional career developmental plan for detention officers to move into supervision within the Detention Center.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal has been achieved.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

The City of Anderson Detention Center has achieved the goal of moving detention officers into positions of management. Each of the four shifts is supervised by a detention supervisor. Each of these supervisors is responsible to the Detention Operations Lieutenant. All five of these supervisors are slated for management training in the near future.

2. Enhance the security of the Detention Center by installing a state of the art digital video recording system throughout the facility.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal awaits completion.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

As of the end of FY11, the "federal jail" has yet to have the necessary security upgrades due to a lack of funding.

3. Pursue accreditation for the Detention Center through the South Carolina Jail Administrators Association. (Note: This is separate and in addition to state accreditation for the Police Department.)

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal will not be completed.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

The SCJAA has eliminated plans for Detention Center accreditation.

4. Evaluate grant-funding possibilities for upgrades.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal has been addressed.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

In FYs 2010 and 2011 the City of Anderson Police Department's personnel who write grant proposals began evaluating the needs of the Detention Center and started researching potential funding agencies. Some proposals have been submitted.

5. Increase the Federal Inmate Population to an average of 76 per day.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal awaits completion.

Reason goal is awaiting completion:

Seventy-six is the approximate max for federal inmates and is therefore a very aggressive goal. The inmate population continues to fluctuate from month to month and results primarily from the number of inmates that the federal law enforcement agencies - including the United States Marshal's Service - decide to place in the city of Anderson. The average daily population of federal inmates in FY11 was 53.78, a decrease from FY10's average daily population of 62.81. Additionally, the range of average daily populations by month for FY11 was 37.93 to 63.65, a range with both lows and highs below fiscal year 2010's lows and highs of 50.84 and 73.9. This downward shift in the range is seen as a potentially negative move for the data set.

6. Increase the amount of in-kind work services provided to the City of Anderson.

Extent to which goal was achieved: This goal was partially achieved in that the In-kind contribution remained constant with FY10 and FY09 at \$302,857. FY09's figure was an increase of 12.7% over FY08.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

In FY09, the inmate work crew was increased from an average of 10 per day to 12 per day.

7. Continue to recruit and hire qualified women and minorities.

Extent to which goal was achieved: The goal was moderately achieved.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

Minority and women recruitment continues to be a priority for the APD Detention Center. As of the end of FY11, there were 13 females and one Hispanic male employed in the Detention Center.

8. Pursue and complete the state accreditation process.

Extent to which goal was achieved: The Detention Center's portion of the City of Anderson Police Department's state accreditation has been completed.

Method(s) used to achieve goal:

According to the Detention Center's managers, all required general orders for the management of the Detention Center have been developed and are complete.

9. Remove visitation from within the jail via the implementation of a video/audio system.

Extent to which goal was achieved: The potential fulfillment of this goal was advanced throughout FY11 and the ground was laid to acquire funding for the system and initiate installation during FY12.

Method(s) used to achieve goal: Various systems were researched and city council has been made aware of the agency's need for a digital visitation system.

IV. <u>Conclusion</u>

The City of Anderson Detention Center had a good year in FY11. As in previous years and consistent with department policy, the public safety was effectively maintained, service was provided in a professional manner, and the Detention Center contributed a substantial amount of funds to the City of Anderson's tax base. The revenue generated by the Detention Center in Fiscal Year 2011 was substantially above the yearly average for the 16-year period ending FY11.

Detention Center management has developed a plan for increasing the federal inmate count and is preparing to meet the challenges of housing the next generation of criminals. The proactive programs which have been enacted in the last few years are beginning to show their anticipated long-range payoffs. The Detention Center plans to continue improving upon current programs and will continue to seek new and innovative approaches to housing inmates.
