**A. PURPOSE**

To define the source for determining the types of crimes that are classified as *Violent* in the state of South Carolina.

**B. POLICY**


All personnel of the City of Anderson Police Department are to review changes in case law in order to keep their knowledge of crimes defined as *violent* up to date.

**C. SOUTH CAROLINA CODE of LAWS 16-1-60 DEFINES the FOLLOWING CRIMES AS VIOLENT:**

1. Violent offenses, as of the date of this general order, are defined as:
  - (a). Murder,
  - (b). Criminal Sexual Conduct, 1st and 2nd degree,
  - (c). Assault and Battery With Intent to Kill,
  - (d). Kidnapping,

- (e) Voluntary Manslaughter,
- (f) Armed Robbery,
- (g) Carjacking,
- (h) Drug Trafficking as defined in Section 44-53-370 (e) and 44-53-375(C),
- (i) Arson in the First and Second Degree,
- (j) Burglary in the First Degree and Second Degree Under Section 16-11-312 (B),
- (k) Engaging a Child for a Sexual Performance,
- (l) Homicide by Child Abuse,
- (m) Aiding and Abetting Homicide by Child Abuse,
- (n) Accessory Before the Fact to Commit any of the Above Offenses, and
- (o) Attempt to Commit Any of the Above Offenses.
